

A CONVOLUTED PREFACE THAT WILL MAKE MORE SENSE AFTER SEEING THE SHOW

The Daughter of Time, a masterpiece of British mystery fiction, explores the life of King Richard III, portrayed most famously by Shakespeare. The story poses the question: "who made Richard III, who was not a hunchback, into a hunchback?" and leads us to the conclusion: "truth is the daughter of time". It's not just Richard III. All of history portrayed as truth tends to be "the daughter of time," chronicled for the convenience of an era and passed on to future generations in hunchbacked form.

This play, Love in Action is half-true and more-than-half fabricated. A single piece of work made up of half and more-than-half is already rather dubious. Indeed, it tells the story of Japan's history in "hunchbacked" form, deviating from historical facts.

British audiences may not be interested in Japanese history, and rightly so. We all have enough on our plates dealing with the complexities of our own country's history, never mind anyone else's.

That said, the historical events portrayed in this play are not limited to Japan. They are a part of history that many people around the world know, or think they know, It's true that I am creating a new, distorted narrative from this history. But at a time when historical events are increasingly told as if they had been inevitable, I cannot help but see that therein lies "the daughter of time." Hideki Noda

ABOUT HIDEKI NODA AND NODAMAP

Hideki Noda was born in 1955 in Nagasaki, Japan. He is a Japanese playwright, director, and actor. While still studying at Tokyo University, in 1976, he founded the theatre company Yume no Yuminsha (Dreaming Bohemian). The company disbanded in 1992, and the following year he founded NODA MAP after studying in the UK. He has created many plays such as Red Demon, The Bee, Egg, In the Forest, Under Cherries in Full Blossom, and Fakespeare. He also writes and directs Kabuki plays and operas, showcasing his creativity in other forms of art beyond contemporary theatre. He has worked extensively in the UK: his Red Demon played the Young Vic in 2003, and The Diver was performed at Soho Theatre in 2008. The first show he wrote in English was The Bee, which was born from a workshop with London actors in 2006. It premiered at the Soho Theatre and received a 5 star review in Time Out, who called it a "highly unusual theatrical gem". The Bee subsequently played Tokyo in English and Japanese and has played New York. He frequently works with actress Kathryn Hunter, and has collaborated with international playwrights and thespians - his works have been performed in 28 cities across 13 countries, including Japan. In 2022, he brought A Night At The Kabuki to London and Taipei to great acclaim, and in January 2023, he became the first Japanese to receive the ISPA 2023 Distinguished Artist Award in recognition of his outstanding achievements in the international performing arts community. In 2008 he was appointed artistic director of Tokyo Metropolitan Theatre. He was awarded an OBE in October 2009. He continues working energetically beyond genres and borders.


